SAFETY EMERGENCY PROCEDURES TRAINING (SEPT)

- Recognise and respond to incidents of turbulence
- Recognise and respond to smoke or fumes on board the aeroplane
- Recognise and respond to incidents of rapid decompression and compression problems
- Recognise and respond to situations requiring evacuation or rapid deplanement
- Recognise and respond to aviation security related incidents

AVIATION MEDICINE (AVMED)

- Demonstrate in-flight medical emergency scene management
- Assess, move and position casualties on board an aeroplane
- Demonstrate understanding of the principles of Aviation Medicine
