

## Safety Emergency Procedures

An emergency is a situation, which arises that endangers the lives of passengers and crew.  
An emergency may result in the necessity to evacuate the aircraft.

Cabin Crew Members are expected to primarily understand and operate safety and emergency equipment.

Safety Emergency Procedures Training covers all the legislated CAA requirements dealing with possible emergency situations which could occur on board an aircraft.
